**CABLE SWEEP – CHANGE ORDER REQUEST**

City Electrical Engineer Mills reported that the contractor's bid price for the Cable Sweep project was \$26,000 lower than the \$80,000 that was budgeted at 18¢ per foot. Mills would like the approval of the Council to use the remaining budget of \$26,000 to sweep an additional 216,000 feet at the bid price of 12¢ per foot. **UPON MOTION OF COUNCILMAN REED, DULY SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN WILLIAMS AND CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 6 TO 0, THE RECOMMENDATION TO ACCEPT THE CHANGE ORDER WAS APPROVED.**

**HISTORICAL REVIEW BOARD RECOMMENDATIONS**

Mayor Sheckles presented the following Historical Review Board recommendations:

Certificates of Appropriateness

- (a) COA-13-16. Ray Smothers, Applicant, and Pikey Conway, Owner, proposes to install door and window signs at 226-A North Third Street.  
Recommendation: Approval of the signs as submitted.
- (b) COA-13-17. Settles Home Supply, Applicant/Owner, proposes to install a building sign at 112 West Flaget Avenue.  
Recommendation: Approval of the sign as submitted.
- (c) COA-13-18. Ford & Associates, Applicant/Owner, proposes to install a projecting sign at 115 East Flaget Avenue.  
Recommendation: Approval of the sign as submitted.
- (d) COA-13-19. Patty Hord, Applicant, and Wayne Shelton, Owner, propose to construct a new carriage house at Gooseberry Alley, just east of 109 South 5<sup>th</sup> Street.  
Recommendation: Approval of the new construction as submitted with the condition that final colors, materials, shutters, and light fixtures be submitted for administrative approval.
- (e) COA-13-20. JTD Holdings LLC, Applicant/Owner, proposes to construct 3 single-family dwellings (condominiums) at 206 East Broadway Avenue (Strawberry Row).  
Recommendation: Approval of the new construction as submitted with the condition that a color sample for the front door of the Cape Cod dwelling be submitted for administrative approval.
- (f) COA-13-22. Becky Newton, Applicant/Owner, proposes to install building sign at rear of 123 North Third Street.  
Recommendation: Approval of the signs as submitted with the conditions that all other Barber Shop signage and pole on front elevation (west) be removed and that a photographic image of the proposed signs and colors be submitted for administrative approval.
- (g) COA-13-11. Thomas M. Bracket proposes to demolish an existing contributing historic structure at 111 East John Fitch Avenue.  
Recommendation: Application tabled until such time as application is fully completed and an inspection by the HRB and/or its representative is conducted. No City Council action required.

**MINUTES**

The minutes from the 04-09-2013 Regular Council meeting were presented. **UPON MOTION OF COUNCILMAN LYDIAN, DULY SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BUCKMAN AND CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 6 TO 0, THE MINUTES WERE APPROVED.**

**SECOND READING – ORDINANCE B2013-06, REZONING #2383 JEREMY CHESSER.**

City Clerk Bryant presented Ordinance B2013-06 for a second reading.

**ORDINANCE NO. B2013-06**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND ADOPTING AS AMENDED ZONING MAP, ENTITLED, "ZONING MAP, CITIES OF BARDSTOWN, BLOOMFIELD, FAIRFIELD, NEW HAVEN, AND NELSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY" BY DESIGNATING 0.41 ACRE AT 215 WEST BEALL AVENUE (LOTS #1-3, SAMUELS AND HUBBARD DIVISION) FROM P-1 (PROFESSIONAL OFFICE DISTRICT) TO R-1B (SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT).**

**WHEREAS**, the Joint City-County Planning Commission of Nelson County, Kentucky, on March 12, 2013, held a public hearing on the Application No. 2383 for Jeremy Chesser to rezone 0.41 acre at 215 West Beall Avenue (Lots #1-3, Samuels and Hubbard Division) from P-1 (Professional Office District) to R-1B (Single Family Residential District).

**WHEREAS**, the City Council members conducted a review of the record and evidence presented before the Joint City-County Planning Commission of Nelson County, Kentucky; and

**UPON MOTION OF** Councilman Williams, duly seconded by Councilman Reed and carried, the City Council approved upon first reading the recommendation stated from the Planning and Zoning Commission to approve the request. The motion included any restrictions or conditions that may have been agreed to by the applicant and the Planning Commission.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Bardstown City Council that:

Boundaries of the district as shown on district map, entitled, "ZONING MAP, CITIES OF BARDSTOWN, BLOOMFIELD, FAIRFIELD, NEW HAVEN AND NELSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY" are hereby amended for reasons adopted and all of which are made a part hereof as if fully set out herein, including the letter of recommendation dated March 29, 2013, from the said Joint City-County Planning Commission of Nelson County to the Bardstown City Council and the property as described:

**“Being Lots 1,2,3 in Samuels and Hubbard Subdivision recorded in the Nelson County Court Clerk’s Office in Deed Book 104, Page 347, each of said lots has a frontage of 25 feet on Beall Street and runs back between lines 242 feet to an alley. “**

This ordinance or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

City Clerk Bryant presented Ordinance B2013-06 for a second reading.

**ORDINANCE NO. B2013-05**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND ADOPTING AS AMENDED AN ORDINANCE CONTAINED IN THE BARDSTOWN CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 92: CEMETERY.**

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED and enacted by the Bardstown City Council, Commonwealth of Kentucky, that Section 92 Section, Section 92.02 How Divided and Sold; Fees and Charges, Section 92.06 Deed of Purchase (B), Section 92.07 Transfer of Lots, Section 92.08 Land Marks to Lots, Section 92.09 Enclosure of Lots; Interments, Section 92.10 Debris from Erecting Monuments, Section 92.11 Rules and Regulations and Section 92.99 Penalty be amended to read as follows:

92.02 HOW DIVIDED AND SOLD; FEES AND CHARGES.

A tract of land described in 92.01 shall be divided and set apart as heretofore, to wit: (See copy of plat filed with Sexton.) The cemetery is laid off in lots/rows of the following sizes, and sold at the following rates:

92.06 DEED OF PURCHASE

(B) The deed, when so made, before it becomes valid, shall be recorded in full on the Bardstown Cemetery Deed Book of the City Council and approved by them, and the Clerk after recording same, shall deliver the original to the purchaser with his/her endorsement of the order book and page thereon. The Sexton shall keep a book in which he/she shall note all transfers of lots ~~are noted~~ and carefully keep a list of all the lots sold and those for sale.

92.07 UNUSED OR TRANSFER OF LOTS.

**(A) The City shall have the right to reclaim unused burial sites through any process authorized by state law (KRS381.715).**

**(B)** No transfer of any lot shall be permitted, except upon the record books and with the consent of the City Council; and the deed of conveyance made, signed, approved and recorded as aforesaid shall be conclusive proof of ownership, and no person shall have the use of or title to any lot until the same is paid for or satisfactorily arranged.

92.08 LAND MARKS TO LOTS.

It shall be the duty of proprietors of lots to place and keep in repair permanent land marks of the boundaries of their respective lots, and to keep same clean, and all improvements of lots shall be subject to the supervision and control of the Public Works ~~Director~~ **Superintendent or cemetery staff.**

92.09 ENCLOSURE OF LOTS; INTERMENTS.

**(A)** No stone or brick walls, entire, or wooden fences shall be erected as enclosures of lots. The proprietor of any lot, **through an approved company,** may erect ~~any~~ proper or suitable stones or monuments thereon **which have been approved by the Sexton.**

**(B) If any tree or shrub, situated on any lot, shall by means of its roots, branches or otherwise, become detrimental, dangerous or inconvenient to the adjacent lots, walks or avenues, it shall be the duty of the Public Works Superintendent to have same removed.**

~~(C) And-All interments on private lots shall be made at least 4 feet deep and the graves dug at least 4-1/2 inches within the line of the lots. and all ornaments that may be erected by individuals on their lots shall be erected as not to obstruct any of the alleys, avenues or walks.~~

**(D) One full burial and two cremations are allowed on a 4' x 9' sized or larger grave space. Double depth interments are not permitted. Scattering of remains in the Cemetery is prohibited.**

92.10 DEBRIS FROM RULES FOR ERECTING MONUMENTS.

**(A) All monuments henceforth placed in the Bardstown Cemetery shall be subject to the rules and regulations set forth by municipal order. Companies doing this type of business shall meet all city requirements as to licenses and fees (including occupation license.) No makeshift or homemade monuments shall be erected in the cemetery.**

~~(B) No person **approved company** erecting monuments, tombs or other structures, shall permit the material or debris therefrom to remain on the ground longer than actually necessary. If any tree or shrub, situated on any lot, shall by means of its roots, branches or otherwise, become detrimental, dangerous or inconvenient to the adjacent lots, walks or avenues, it shall be the duty of the Public Works Superintendent to have same removed.~~

92.11 RULES AND REGULATIONS.

~~(A) The City Cemetery is subject to the following rules and regulations in order that the maintenance of the cemetery may be kept at a reasonable rate and so that the beautification and order of the cemetery may be maintained.~~

~~(B) No person shall leave any horse or other animal, whether attached to a vehicle or not, unfastened in the cemetery grounds. No person shall enter the grounds with intoxicating liquors, or ride or drive faster than a walk or ride or drive upon the grass, or write upon or otherwise injure or deface any monument, headstone, fence, or other structure. No person shall plant nor pluck any flower, either wild or cultivated, any tree, shrub or plant therein, or remove therefrom any plant or flower without the consent of the Public Works Superintendent and if any person violates the provisions of this section he shall, for each offense, be fined a sum not less than \$25 nor more than \$100. The Sexton shall see that the provisions of this section are observed, and shall have power to expel from the grounds any person or persons found violating these rules.~~

~~(1) No trees shall be planted in the cemetery.~~

~~(2) All evergreens and hedges or bushes of any type must be planted only upon approval of the Sexton to assure their proper location and to prevent over planting, thereby hindering the upkeep of the cemetery. Also, the bushes, evergreens or hedges of any type shall be kept trimmed and pruned to an appropriate height; the Sexton shall have the authority to do so and may destroy those plants if need be to maintain and beautify the cemetery.~~

~~(3) All graves in the cemetery shall be kept flat without any mounds.~~

~~(4) No curbs, fences or any type of construction shall be done around the border of lots in the cemetery.~~

~~(5) The four (4) corners of each lot may be marked by corner stones of any type, but must be kept level with tip of ground to ensure ease of mowing grass.~~

~~(6) The daily maintenance, care, and embellishment of the cemetery is under the supervision of the Sexton.~~

~~(7) No articles are allowed that would hinder safety, maintenance and mowing.~~

~~(8) All vases or other arrangements that are secured to the monument are considered acceptable.~~

~~(9) No flower arrangements, or other articles shall be placed on or in or on the ground.~~

**(A) The Bardstown City Council shall promulgate by municipal order the rules and regulations to keep and preserve the beautification and the order of the cemetery. The rules and regulations shall provide for the care, use, operation and maintenance of the cemetery. The rules and regulations may be amended by Municipal Order of the Bardstown City Council.**

**(B) The Bardstown Cemetery disclaims all responsibility for loss or damage from causes beyond its reasonable control. This includes theft, vandalism, explosions, and unavoidable accidents caused by acts of war, acts of nature or acts of God.**

SECTION 92.99 PENALTY.

**Any person or entity violating any of the regulations promulgated by adoption of a Municipal Order under the provisions of this chapter shall upon conviction be deemed to have committed a violation and shall**

**be fined not less than \$50 nor more than \$250 for each offense.**

This ordinance or parts of ordinance in conflict herewith are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect following publication as required by law.

**MUNICIPAL ORDER NO. 2013-05, CEMETERY RULES AND REGULATIONS**

City Attorney presented Municipal Order No. 2013-05:

**MUNICIPAL ORDER 2013 - 05**

The Bardstown City Council of Bardstown, Kentucky hereby adopts the following Rules and Regulations for the Bardstown Cemetery as Recommended by the Bardstown Cemetery Committee as a Municipal Order:

**BARDSTOWN CEMETERY  
RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. No person shall leave any animal unfastened in the cemetery grounds. No person shall enter the grounds with intoxicating liquors, or drive faster than 15 miles per hour, or ride or drive on the grass, or write on or otherwise injure or deface any monument, headstone, fence, or other structure.
2. No person shall plant nor pluck any flower, either wild or cultivated, any tree, shrub or plant therein, or remove any tree, shrub, plant or flower without the consent of the Public Works Superintendent or City Groundskeeper. Cemetery staff may have the authority to remove plants, trees, shrubs or other vegetation, if need be, to maintain and beautify the cemetery.
3. All graves in the cemetery shall be kept flat without any mounds.
4. All vases or other arrangements that are permanently secured to a monument are considered acceptable. Real or artificial flowers are permitted in those vases. Should real or artificial flowers become faded, detached, ragged, worn in appearance or damaged by any other means, the Cemetery staff may remove the flowers after notifying owners who have previously contacted the office of the Sexton.
5. During the dates of November 1<sup>st</sup> through January 15<sup>th</sup>, all fixed arrangements are allowed near or on the monument. January 16<sup>th</sup> through October 31<sup>st</sup>, no flower arrangements, toys, balloons, eternal flames, shepherd’s hooks or other loose articles shall be placed on the monument or in or on the ground that would cause debris or hinder safety, maintenance or mowing.
6. The maintenance, care, and embellishment of the cemetery are under the supervision of the Public Works Superintendent or City Groundskeeper. Maintenance of the cemetery will be conducted on a monthly basis, except during the mowing season.

This Municipal Order shall be in full force and effect following publication of Ordinance B2013-05.

Be it resolved by the Legislative Body of the City of Bardstown that:

The Legislative Body of the City of Bardstown does hereby accept all streets referred to in said Contract as being city streets which are a part of the City of Bardstown; and

The Legislative Body of the City of Bardstown does hereby ratify and adopt all statements, representations, warranties, covenants, and agreements contained in said Contract and does hereby accept said Contract and by such acceptance agrees to all the terms and conditions therein stated; and

The Chief Executive Officer of the said City of Bardstown is hereby authorized and directed to sign said Contract as set forth on behalf of the Legislative Body of Bardstown, and the City Clerk of Bardstown is hereby authorized and directed to certify thereto.

**MUNICIPAL ORDER NO. 2013-07, PARKING SPACES ON SOUTH THIRD STREET**

City Clerk Bryant presented Municipal Order No. 2013-07:

**MUNICIPAL ORDER NO. 2013-07  
R E S O L U T I O N**

Adoption of a resolution by the Bardstown City Council to outline parking spaces on the East and West sides of the 100 block of South Third Street in the City of Bardstown.

**WHEREAS**, the Bardstown City Council desires to promote safety and encourage detailed parking areas for traffic on the 100 block of South Third Street.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of April, 2013, by the Bardstown City Council:

That outlined parking spaces are desired on the East side and West side of South Third Street from East Stephen Foster Avenue to West Flaget Avenue and that the City of Bardstown's Public Works Department shall install the painted lines to indicate the parking space areas.

**UPON MOTION OF COUNCILMAN ROYALTY, DULY SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN REED AND CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 6 TO 0, MUNICIPAL ORDER NO. 2013-07 WAS APPROVED.**

**NEW AND RE-APPOINTMENTS**

Mayor Sheckles recommended the new appointment of Tom L. Hall to fill the unexpired, 3-year term of Ed Jury on the Bardstown Tree Board. Mr. Jury passed away in 2012. Mayor Sheckles also recommended the re-appointment of Clara Mackin Fulkerson to the Wickland Board for a one year term. **UPON MOTION OF COUNCILMAN SIMPSON, DULY SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN ROYALTY AND CARRIED BY A VOTE OF 6 TO 0, THE APPOINTMENTS WERE APPROVED.**

**HISTORICAL REVIEW BOARD ADMINISTRATOR POSITION**

Mayor Sheckles revisited the need to hire a full-time person for the Historical Review Board Administrator position. Members of the HRB spoke as well as members of the Nelson County Planning and Zoning Commission expressing the need for this position to be full-time. After the Council members gave their recommendations for full-time vs part-time needs, P & Z Director Johnston-Crowe reminded the Council that if the position was not filled, she was only obligated to administer "secretarial" duties for the HRB. She asked the Council to consider the department of Planning and Zoning as a whole and give them the resources to go beyond their daily tasks. Mayor Sheckles asked to go on record and stated that he has not always agreed with the decisions of the HRB or its director, but he does recognize that we are where we are, we are who we are, because of where we have been and where we are going. If we strive to be a cultural district and a progressive city moving forward, to split hairs about why this position is not an important one, will take us a giant step backward. To say that we cannot afford this position is not right because we are in a better financial position now than we have been in the last 14 years. We need to put an energetic person in the position at a salary that we can all agree on and move forward.

**UPON MOTION OF COUNCILMAN BUCKMAN, DULY SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN WILLIAMS, THE RECOMMENDATION TO FUND A FULL-TIME HRB ADMINISTRATOR WAS NOT APPROVED. THE VOTE WAS 4-2. COUNCILMEN BUCKMAN AND WILLIAMS VOTED YES, COUNCILMEN SIMPSON, REED, LYDIAN AND ROYALTY VOTED NO.**

**COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Councilman Reed announced that the Recreation Board will have a regular meeting on April 25, 2013. He recommended that a Finance Committee meeting be held soon.

Mayor Sheckles announced that a Working Session and/or a Special Council Meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 7, 2013 at 5:00pm.

**STAFF REPORTS**

Fire Chief Howard reported that hydrant testing would begin next Monday. He thanked the police department and the public works department employees for their help with a house fire on West Muir Avenue.

Police Chief McCubbin reported on a situation that involved a special needs student from Bardstown City Schools. Due to the help of social media, the local media and the public, the student was found within an hour.

Mayor Sheckles announced the 5-year anniversary of Chris Smith with the Bardstown Police Department.

**CEMETERY DEED**
